EDITOR'S NOTES

As I write this, I'm in San Francisco. The Seminar on Ericksonian Approaches to Hypnosis and Psychotherapy ended today. A review will probably appear in the next issue, but a short summary is appropriate in this space. First, the large number of attendees (approx. 425) offered ample proof that interest in Ericksonian approaches is growing geometrically. For some, this was their first intensive exposure to the approaches. For others, it was an opportunity to add to their existing skills and knowledge. Second, it is also apparent that many different conceptions, frameworks and teaching/training styles have been developed around Ericksonian work. The most frequent complaint overheard was the agonizing choice of which session to attend, as there were usually four excellent seminars held simultaneously. Luckily, all the presentations were audiotaped and are available through the Foundation. In addition, some of the sessions were videotaped for the Erickson Archives and some commercial distribution.

A review of the Erickson Congress was published in the January-February 1981 issue of the **Family Therapy Network Newsletter**, Volume 5, No. 1, by Judith Mazza, Ph.D.

Steve Lankton, Carol Lankton and Michael Brown had an article on "Psychological Level Communication in Transactional Analysis" published in the T.A. Journal, Volume 11, No. 4, October 1981, pages 287-299.

Reflections on Therapy, and Other Essays, by Jay Haley, has been published by The Family Therapy Institute of Washington, D.C., 4602 North Park Ave., Chevy Chase, Maryland 20015. The volume is a collection of some of Haley's papers and essays. Previous unpublished works are contained in the book including Haley's Keynote address at the Erickson Congress in December 1980.

Two speeches from the Erickson Congress were published in the February 1981 issue of Svensk Tidskrift For Hypnos. The two articles were Jay

Haley's Keynote address and Marion Moore's presentation on principles of induction.

The Dutch Directive Therapy group has initiated publication of the Dutch Journal of Directive Therapy and Hypnosis. The first issue appeared in February, 1981 and contained a Dutch language translation of Richard Van Dyck's presentation at the Erickson Congress entitled "How To Use Ericksonian Approaches When You Are Not Milton Erickson". The second issue included a Dutch language translation of an interview conducted with Jay Haley at the Congress by Kees Hooduin and Else de Haam.

Erickson's collected papers were recently offered as the Main Selection by the Behavioral Science Book Service.

A date and price have been set for the edited volume of the First International Congress, entitled Ericksonian Approaches to Hypnosis and Psychotherapy (edited by Jeff Zeig). RESEARCH / CLASSES / LECTURES

Jesse S. Miller, Ph.D., president-elect of the Northern California Society of Clinical Hypnosis will present a series of lectures on Ericksonian "strategic therapy" at the University of California campuses during the Winter and Spring of 1982. comparing direct and indirect hypnotic inductions and suggestions. They are investigating the relationship between cognitive/personality styles and hypnotic responsiveness. The springboard for this research was Dr. Erickson's contention that indirect confusional techniques were particularly appropriate with obsessive, resistant, and challenging subjects. They have developed the Wexler/Alman Indirect Hypnotic Susceptibility Scale. This was devised through a thorough reworking of the Harvard Group Scale of Hypnotic Susceptibility, with the language and pacing now permissive, naturalistic and confusional rather than more direct and authoritative. By correlating results on these two scales with measures of psychological differentiation (field dependence/ independence), they hope to help discriminate which types generally respond better to a direct or an indirect approach. The other product of this research will be the development of a measure aimed at assessing responsiveness to indirect approaches.
