

This workshop focuses on how a trance state is achieved, and includes definition of the necessary elements of a trance induction, description of the characteristics of each element, and instruction on how to elicit trance behavior and phenomena. Discussant: Jeffrey K. Zeig, Ph.D. This is a training videotape for the advanced practitioner of hypnosis. The subject of the presentation is symbolic hypnotherapy. The program consists of two parts: The first part is a 40 minute lecture by Jeffrey K. Zeig, Ph.D. on the use of symbols in psychotherapy and hypnotherapy. The viewer will be able to see the effect of Erickson's work and the way in which Erickson seeds his therapy and works in consecutive sessions.
