LETTER

July 25, 1983

I have just returned to the United States after a year's absence. During this time, I was kept up-to-date on happenings within the Milton H. Erickson Foundation by members of my family, by the Newsletter and other mailings.



BOOK REVIEW

Healing in Hypnosis: The Seminars. Workshops and Lectures of Milton H. Erickson, Volume 1 (Edited by Ernest Rossi, Florence Sharp and Margaret Ryan)

This is the first volume of a projected three-to-five volume series transcribing Erickson's talks from the 1960's, when he gave numerous talks around the country. Florence Sharp began collecting tapes of these talks years ago to ensure that they wouldn't be lost forever. The time is finally right for their publication and she has been assisted in this task by Ernest Rossi, coauthor of several books with Erickson, and Margaret Ryan, who assisted in the preparation of the previous Erickson and Rossi volumes.

This is a great book. For the most part. Erickson is allowed to speak for himself. The editors have confined themselves to cleaning up the grammar and to breaking the material into sections to organize it. Rossi comments occasionally on the transcript to clarify some obscure remark or to offer his interpretation of Erickson's approach. I could have done without the interpretive comments, but others may find them helpful.


A biography of Erickson is included in the first part of the book. This is a very personal piece by Rossi that says almost as much about Rossi as it does about Erickson, although several new facts about Erickson are included.

There will be a tape of one of the lectures included with the book, which is currently scheduled to be released at about the same time you receive this newsletter. It will be published by Irvington Publishers.
